## STATEMENT OF CLAIM

- 1. The Plaintiff are the citizens of the Republic of India and are engaged in the activity of farming in several different states of India.
- 2. The Defendant is the signatory of the The Universal Declaration of Human Rights and has been engaged in activities that are in Violation of Article 10, Article 21 and Article 25.
- 3. The present government in the Union of India has legislated certain laws that are contrary to the interests of the Plaintiff, these laws only affect the Plaintiff and do not have any bearing on any other citizen of the Republic of India. The Plaintiff has exercised its rights under Article 20 and assembled in a peaceful

protest in order to express their discontent with the enacted laws.

- 4. The Defendant has not made any efforts to provide the Plaintiff with an opportunity to redress, neither a referendum has been proposed for the class of the Plaintiff nor the laws have been declared inoperable until the next general elections, so that the Plaintiff can exercise their rights under Article 21 and get a fair treatment.
- 5. The Defendant has forced the Plaintiff to inhumane conditions, the farmers of the Republic of India are battling severe cold and are forced to assemble in millions during the ongoing Corona Virus-19 pandemic.
- 6. The Defendant has caused the death of 200 farmers of the Republic of India, whose deaths are directly related to their participation in the ongoing protest. This has violated the rights provided by Article 25, which could have prevented through peaceful dialogue.
- 7. The Defendant had periodically shut off internet services on and around the protest sites, therefore preventing the Plaintiff from expressing their views to their audience, this has violated Article 19.
- 8. The Plaintiff urges the Security council to intervene and secure their human rights, using sanctions or such other relief as is deemed just.
